Hello Everyone,

This is our last newsletter for the Term and what a term it has been! This week someone was pulled over for speeding just in front of the school. Unfortunately for them it was lunchtime and it was a highlight for the children in the yard. Even more so when the constable turned their car around and came over to the increasing crowd of students. She got out and chatted to everyone and turned on the lights and sirens briefly, which was a big hit!

Just a reminder that for the time being there will still not be any lunch orders for Term 3. The kitchen part of kitchen garden is also affected and we are brainstorming ways in which we can deliver some sort of kitchen experience and comply with the increased hygiene controls, so we can't promise anything.

For the moment the current situation remains the same and there are no excursions/incursions allowed. School sports against other teams have definitely been cancelled this year, which leaves us just with internal sports activities. Although some camps have reopened, not all have and our booked camp sites remain closed. It is expected that we will not be able to run camps this year. Should there be any change to the current situation, we will let families know.

During our return to onsite schooling the wellbeing of students has been prioritised. There has certainly been a wide variety of student responses to having been in isolation at home and we have been restoring classroom and yard expectations. This week the 1/2 classes celebrated filling their classroom doors with SWPB values, having done a lot to settle back into school. They watched a movie and ate fish and chips. The Preps had a movie and took their teddies on a bear hunt!

Following DET guidelines, our student reports have gone out to families without the five point scale of achievement. Now that we are all back on site, staff have not wasted any time in assessing students and preparing for Term 3. We expect that early in Term 3 students will have set their learning goals for the semester and parents will be able to discuss these with their child and their child's teacher (most likely via Webex). An emphasis will also remain on student wellbeing during Term 3.







Shadow puppet workshops is kids' play

Want to try your hand at making and telling a story with shadow puppets?

Kyneton Town Hall's school holiday program KTH Kids has gone online and is offering a shadow puppet workshop with local artists.

Children can join this free workshop at any time during the school holiday period through short instructional videos

The videos will engage children from ages four to 14 years, in the art of shadow puppet making, including construction methods, performance and storytelling.

And, once constructed, you can bring your shadow puppets to life in your very own shadow puppet show.

Parents are encouraged to make this a family project and share with others by uploading their puppet show and telling their personal stories online. These stories will help create a collective body of work exploring family stories through shadow play.

The group facilitators are local artists, Steve Scott and Sue Blakey, who have been performing nationally and internationally for more than 30 years.

They are experts in children's entertainment including puppetry, performance, roving entertainment and all things that engage children in fun and educational activities.

Cool Changes program goes online

In the absence of face-to-face community workshops, Council's local climate action plan is taking a new online format.

In a survey conducted earlier this year, 80 per cent of respondents indicated support for, or commitment to, developing a community climate action plan using a mix of online platforms.

Council will be working with consultants Hip V Hype to conduct Cool Changes Woodend during the next few months, for the area covered by postcode 3442.

Cool Changes 3442 will demonstrate how communities across the state can plan for climate action in the absence of community workshops.

A project hub has been established as an interactive online ideas and discussion platform that will serve as the central point for content to be included in the plan.

The site stores information and resources relevant to the project, and allows people to submit their ideas for local action on climate change and to exchange commentary.

As part of the project design, there will also be 'live' conversations hosted by project participants, to help gather further content to include the action plan.
